


















Lydia called me back yesterday afternoon and we had a good chat.

'Dirty Dancing' makes all the right moves

If you had any doubts about the place "Dirty Dancing" holds in popular culture, consider that a twist on the movie's most famous line — "Nobody puts Baby in a corner" — now lights up the trafic signs above Interstate 235. Someone at the Iowa Department of Transportation has programmed the signs this week to declare that "Nobody puts Baby in a hot car."

The reminder comes just in time, of course, for the national tour of the "Dirty Dancing" musical, a nostalgia-powered vehicle that pulled into the Des Moines Civic Center on Tuesday night and is parked there until Sunday. It's fueled by a

deep tank of affection for the 1987 movie, starring Patrick Swayze and Jennifer Grey.


same emotional buttons. If you're a fan of the movie, you won't be disappointed — and afterward you'll want to go home and push the buttons on your DVD player to watch the movie for the gazillionth time.

Adapted by the original writer, Eleanor Bergstein, and directed by James Powell, the show follows Baby (Gillian Abbott) and Johnny (Christopher Tierney) through all of the same steps of their romance in the summer of 1963, when they meet at a resort in upstate New York. There are a few extra references to politics and social issues -- the resort guests and staff haul a radio out to the campfire to listen to Martin Luther King Jr.'s "I Have a Dream" speech — but Bergstein has said those scenes were part of her

original concept for the movie. They don't add a lot to the stage version, and except for a few clunky lines early on, they don't really detract from it, either. They're just a reminder that Baby isn't the only one who's growing up.

She is just out of high school when she and her well-to-do family take their vacation at the Catskill resort, where the staff offers as tedious array of Scrabble, croquet and after-dinner dances that reek of Lawrence Welk. So like any smart teenager, Baby sneaks away to the secret parties in the staff quarters, where the rebellious dance instructor Johnny soon teaches her some new moves

Until this point, the show feels like "Hair-spray" or "Memphis" or any of the other throw-back musicals in which well-behaved rich (and mostly white) people dance to foxtrots while the cool kids cut loose out

back. Baby and Johnny's class-crossing love affair feels familiar, too. But "Dirty Dancing" gets a lift, both literal and figurative, from

their obvious chemistry. Abbott's Baby is both vulnerable and brave, and the actress (with a degree from Juilliard and experience with Cirque du Soleil) is good at pretending she is just learning how to groove. Tierney's Johnny sounds and looks like the leonine Swayze even though the stage actor is clearly a better-trained dancer. (He's from Hubbard Street Dance in Chicago.)

But as seriously talented as they are, they don't take themselves too seriously. When they practice their lifts in the famous scene in the lake, they know the audience can see through the illu-

id, especially Johnny's dance partner Penny (Jenny Winton), whose unwanted pregnancy provides the plot's tension. But what may strike you most about the supporting cast is the sheer length of all those dancing legs in tight jeans and high-waisted shorts (by Jennifer Irwin). The cast is more racially diverse than in the movie, but they're all shaped like Ken and Barbie.

Two of them, Doug Carpenter and Jennlee Shallow, take the lead on several of the best songs, including the inevitable "(I've Had) The Time of My Life" at the end. But there are snippets of so



Munson: Life-saving messages spark Iowa's roadside quips

AMES, Ia. — If state government ever produces its own late-night TV comedy show, its roots could be traced back to this unlikely writing duo inside the Iowa Department of Transportation.

Traffic engineer Willy Sorenson and his colleague Tracey Bramble make each other howl with laughter as they brainstorm months' worth of humorous messages — with input from colleagues and the public — to be flashed each Monday on dozens of digital road signs statewide.

You think it's difficult to be simultaneously pithy, funny and informative on Twitter with its 140-character limit? Try no more than 54 characters — three lines of 18 apiece.

Sorenson and Bramble have authored such windshield classics as "Get your head out of your apps, drive safely" (actor <u>George Takei of "Star Trek" fame</u> loved that one) and "May the 4th be with you, text I will not" (repeat in your best Yoda voice).

They're responsible for perhaps the most prominent, public series of one-liners in Iowa. Drivers spot their work suspended over the roadway on 29-foot-long digital signs for an average of 12 seconds at a time.

Monday's message, flashed across 74 signs statewide, was more straightforward by recent standards: "Exit to text it."

"We watch movies and we have kids and we listen to Katy Perry way too much sometimes," Bramble said. Like any creative team, Sorenson and Bramble gradually have found their voice and gotten more adventurous. They've also learned that inspiration may come from anywhere.

It was Sorenson's teenage son who inspired "Not buckled? Seriously??"

Beloved baseball flick "The Sandlot" was the source of Sorenson's favorite message thus far: "Not buckled? You're killing me Smalls."

Both Bramble and Andrea Henry, the DOT's communications director, love "May the 4th be with you." That convinced scores of TV newscasters to talk like Yoda.

Last month, "Nobody puts baby in a hot car," pegged to the arrival of the "Dirty Dancing" musical at the Des Moines Civic Center, pranced its way across social media.

These might be the most scrutinized phrases in the state. Sorenson and Bramble are the primary authors. But they must submit each message for approval in a biannual committee meeting. And, of course, DOT Director Paul Trombino has final say.

Last week I got to join the fall "Message Monday" meeting at the DOT compound in the middle of Ames. It felt like the Midwestern state government version of what it must be like to sit in with the "Saturday Night Live" or "Daily Show" writers in New York.

I even convinced the committee to let me reveal a couple of upcoming messages as I studied their (giggly) deliberations.

What Des Moines clothier Raygun has done with T-shirts, the DOT seems to be trying to do with its signs: Leverage them for relevant, timely editorial commentary.

Such roadway quips have become a <u>certifiable trend</u>, with more states relying on humor to grab drivers' eyeballs. Iowa is among perhaps a dozen states, DOT officials said, that now broadcast these sorts of messages.

Sorenson forwarded his entire message list to Utah, which recently launched its own campaign.

Massachusetts received press coverage last year for its messages, some of which exploit regional dialect: "Use yah blinkah."

This summer Missouri borrowed "Get your head out of your apps."

Iowa's messages first appeared two years ago, before the official June 2014 launch of the DOT's "Zero Fatalities" campaign.

Not every weekly installment has been rapturously received. An angry woman emailed Sorenson to protest "Nobody puts baby in a hot car"; her friend's child had died precisely that way. Bramble also spreads these messages through the DOT's blogs and Twitter and Facebook accounts.

Sorenson called and asked her whether she wanted that to happen to anybody else? No, of course not, she replied.

"Neither do we," he told her. "And that is exactly why we're doing it."

"When she started hearing that it wasn't the sign talking to her anymore," Sorenson said, "that it was us as individuals talking to her, she got it."

"We're doing this to try to save lives. We're not doing it to get a chuckle. ... We're trying to change people's behavior.""

"We're doing this to try to save lives," Bramble said. "We're not doing it to get a chuckle. ... We're trying to change people's behavior."

But this "more human form of government," as Henry put it, does beg extra caution.

Traditional traffic engineering doesn't even embrace punctuation, let alone irreverent humor and pop culture references.

The messages have gotten a little edgier ("Texting & driving? Oh cell no!"). But the DOT committee so far has been too skittish to blast the state with this one: "Speeding is for the birds; slow the flock down."

I laughed out loud when I heard it. And it seems to be the underground favorite at the DOT.

The finer points of ruttin'

Sorenson, Bramble and Henry last week were joined around the conference table by Steve Gent, director of traffic safety, and Jan Laaser-Webb, safety engineer, with one more committee member absent.

The messages are kept under wraps until this meeting, displayed one at a time on a projection screen.

WHOLE LOTTA

RUTTIN' GOING ON

WATCH FOR DEER

The committee debated: Do enough people understand "rutting" (sex-crazed deer)?

Does "ruttin" look too much like "rotten" at first glance?

Bramble said that she would include a YouTube video of Jerry Lee Lewis' "Whole Lotta Shakin' Going On" alongside the message on the blog.

One of the DOT's target demographics is men ages 25 to 40. So a topic that includes hunting and rutting (and anything that rhymes with "beer," I might add) should cater to them.

The message passed intact.

Another example:

GIVE BLOOD

THE RIGHT WAY

NOT THE HIGH WAY

Or ...

GIVE BLOOD

THE RIGHT WAY

NOT ON THE HIGHWAY

The first option feels like the DOT is encouraging marijuana use, Henry said: It's OK to get high, just not after you've given blood.

Laaser-Webb said that she would assume "high way" to be a typo — an accidental extra space.

Gent questioned "the right way": Is there another phrase more commonly associated with blood donation?

Sorenson Googled a range of options; the committee pondered "give blood, give life."

But Sorenson also advocated for maintaining the rhyme (right way and highway). But "Give blood today" was deemed too strong a push for a non-traffic-related cause.

So the second version won.

'Next big wave of safety'

Annual traffic fatalities in Iowa have hit historic lows: The 317 killed in 2013 represented the fewest highway deaths since World War II, followed last year by 321. So far this year, 245 have died. While the humorous inspiration for these messages may come from anywhere, the DOT tries to focus on five areas that represent the most common behavioral contributors to traffic deaths: not wearing seat belts, speeding, drunken/drugged driving, distracted driving and drowsy driving.

But that also means, Bramble said, that "the low-hanging fruit has been picked."

Cars and roads have seen safer designs for years, Gent said. Now it's down to human behavior as the "next big wave of safety."

Thus roadway humor has become a popular method of trying to nudge drivers' behavior in the right direction. Traffic engineers see the weekly schedule as a delicate compromise between making sure the messages stay prominent but don't get monotonous.

But are they effective? There's been no specific evaluation of Iowa's campaign or funny DOT signs in general. A <u>study in four major cities of the impact of public service announcements</u> on these "dynamic message signs" indicated that they're likely to be generally effective, although not as much with young men. Most of all the studies seemed to emphasize the need for more detailed research.

Another concern: Might these messages be too successful? Too eye-catching? (Admit it: Have you tweeted a photo of a DOT quip while driving?)

The DOT writing team has not received a single report of a crash or similar incident linked to the signs. Sorenson also analyzed Iowa interstate traffic the day that one of the more popular messages was released. He can tap into live GPS data that pulls from freight fleet vehicles on the road. There was no slowdown or bottleneck around the signs.

So for now it's full speed ahead on "Hey bobblehead stop looking at your phone," "Don't press your luck, no Whammies" and "Drink green beer see red lights in rearview mirror."

Not to mention that the Message Monday approval sessions are the most fun DOT meetings of the year, Gent said.

Suggest your own ideas on the DOT's <u>Facebook page</u>, on <u>Twitter</u> or by filling out the <u>feedback form</u> on the department's website. But keep in mind how Sorenson characterized his litmus test for appropriate messages:

"We may bring you up to the line," he said, "but we're not going to cross it."

I hold out hope that "Speeding is for the birds; slow the flock down" yet may fall on the favorable side of that line and some Monday soon shine ahead of me on the interstate in all its glory

 1 run off the road right (and wearing a seat belt)
- 3 were alcohol related (and wearing a seat belt)
- $2 \ \text{deaths}$ (6%) were not their fault. They were buckled passengers.



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

How has Star Wars been used to decrease the number of people killed in vehicle crashes on Iowa roads?

As of Thursday, December 31, 2015—New Year's Eve—the number of fatalities reached 318, only one more than the all-time low of 317 fatalities in 2013. In comparison, during this time last year, the number was still at 320 fatalities.

With the belief that the only number acceptable is zero, the Iowa Department of Transportation (Iowa DOT) created Zero Fatalities, a multi-media program implemented on Iowa's high-traffic roadways.

By relaying its message of traffic safety in many forms to the drivers of Iowa's roads since the program's inception in June 2014, the Iowa DOT is using every tool at its disposal, which includes something known as "Message Monday."

Message Monday

Often seen on Interstate 35 (I-35) electronic message boards, Message Monday promotes safety subtly.

In the weeks leading up to the release of *Star Wars: The Force Awakens*, the Iowa DOT incorporated Star Wars-themed messages like "Texting and Driving Leads to the Dark Side."

However, some Message Monday messages are not so subtle and lighthearted. When they are not going for a laugh or smile, the message boards are set to display the current number of annual road fatalities.

For example, Iowans driving to see the new *Star Wars* at their local theater on December 18, 2015, using I-35, would have seen that the count had surpassed 300.

The main subjects of these messages come from prevention factors identified from common crash causes. These factors include slowing down, focusing on the road, driving sober, and buckling up. The people behind Zero Fatalities create new messages every Monday to be seen by drivers for the rest of that week.

As much as commuters may enjoy these weekly memos, Message Monday isn't always Zero Fatalities' most reliable option for educating drivers on safety. Since these messages share the same electronic message boards as amber alerts or winter storm warnings, they are not consistently on display.

Prohm, Ferentz, and Jacobson

Zero Fatalities believes in marketing its message to every driver on Iowa's roads, whether they be young teens or mature adults. The Iowa DOT, and the people behind its media program, believe every crash is preventable. And they believe every driver to be capable of preventing these crashes.

Their newest media effort uses various coaches from Iowa's three central colleges to inform drivers of crash prevention factors. University of Iowa football coach Kirk Ferentz, Iowa State University men's basketball coach Steve Prohm, and University of Northern Iowa men's basketball coach Ben Jacobson have all joined the effort.

Remember: Drive sober, buckle up, don't text and drive, stay alert, and pay attention to the speed limit. And "may the force be with you."







CEDAR RAPIDS, Iowa (KCRG-TV9) – The National Motorists Association Foundation declared June as Lane Courtesy Month. The association said yielding for faster traffic is a simple concept, but many drivers forget, which can cause congestion and dangerous situations.

The Iowa Department of Transportation said June is the beginning of the heaviest highway travel period in the state.

Officials said the courtesy rule is an important one to remember.

"That includes kind of watching where you are in your lane, getting over to the right on a multiple lane road, that's the courtesy part of it," Transportation Planner Cathy Cutler said. "So people that maybe are going a little faster can get around, it really just helps the highways operate more smoothly if everyone's kind of going a consistent speed."



Iowa law indicates slow traffic must move right on multiple lane roads, and Cutler said there's plenty of reminders along the roadways also.

"We have about 700 signs on our highways indicating that the slower motors need to move to the right. Just a reminder to people it's a courteous thing to do and safe thing to do," Cutler said.

With June, July, and August being the peak travel months drivers should remember to obey all traffic laws including distracted driving. That means no cellphones, eating, or smoking behind the wheel.

Cutler said drivers should remember their number one job is driving.

Thank you for your note regarding our Message Monday program. We are glad you enjoy them. I also want to thank you for expressing your concern about today's message and the way it could be misconstrued. As with many of our messages we display on our digital overhead signs, we use double meaning to try to express safety. We were using a play on words to state that the decisions you make while behind the wheel can have an impact to the duration of your life. We are also making a statement about how recalls on cars can impact safety and the need to make sure you take care of any recalls on your vehicle. The department always puts out a corresponding blog post on each weekly overhead message to further talk about the subject we are focusing on each week. Links to those posts can be found on our Twitter and Facebook pages or directly through our blog at http://www.transportationmatters.iowadot.gov/2017/02/message-monday-for-feb-6-both-cars-and-people-can-be-recalled-by-their-maker.html.

The purpose of placing safety messages on our overhead signs each Monday in conjunction with the year to date number of fatalities is to get people thinking about how their behavior impacts the number of deaths and the ultimate safety of the roadway. Hundreds of people continue to die on Iowa's roadways and unfortunately last year we saw a significant increase in the number of deaths. As the state, we continue to work to engineer safer roads, pass laws to improve safety, and patrol the roadways, but these fatalities continue to occur. The one thing we cannot control is how a driver behaves behind the wheel. According to a study by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) 94% of crashes are due to driver decision. We often use messages that have double meanings, entertain, or take people by surprise. They most certainly are different than what people are used to hearing from government agencies. However, we find that those messages are more effective because they cause you to think about the message and even continue to have the conversation with friends, families and others about the message. We are hoping that those conversations will lead people to think about how they are driving and make safer choices behind the wheel.

Drivers in Arizona may have noticed a quirky addition in their highway commutes — funny safety messages from the Arizona Department of Transportation.

"DRINKING & DRIVING GO TOGETHER LIKE PEAS & GUAC," read the sign in November 2015 normally used for Amber Alerts and traffic information. After that came Star Wars references, "TRUST THE FORCE BUT ALWAYS BUCKLE UP."

Adele, Pokémon and the movie Elf have each had their own sign, as well as a sign for each holiday.

Now, a little more than a year later, ADOT has enjoyed a growing social media presence and is wrapping up its first "safety message contest."

The contest, which received more than 6,700 submissions according to ADOT, was narrowed down to 20 finalists. Voters spent first two weeks of March deciding which two would flash overhead in April.

Doug Pacey, a spokesperson for ADOT, said the department's social media presence has grown considerably as of late. This increase in social media notoriety is, in part, thanks to the safety message signs, Pacey said.

ADOT now has over 165,000 Twitter followers, an increase from 56,000 just over two years ago. Its Facebook page boasts nearly 40,000 likers. Its Twitter has the second most followers of any transportation department in the country, following Washington State.

Pacey said the messages were a spin-off from Iowa's Department of Transportation, which had been displaying quirky or funny messages for about a year.

"(Iowa had) been having some tests with it and he (Deputy Director for Policy Kevin Biesty) thought we could do it too," Pacey said. "Because there are times when the boards aren't being used, when we're not displaying crash info, traffic times, Amber Alerts, Silver Alerts or things like that, we can put these safety messages up there and try to engage the public in safe driving."

The "peas and guac" message was a jab at a recipe from The New York Times that recommended people to add peas to their guacamole. The recipe was met with criticism from all corners of the internet.

"We kind of jumped in the pool with these safety messages, we didn't dip our toe in with that one and it was really well received," Pacey said. "It was popular, most people really enjoyed it and liked it and the important thing is it got people talking about drinking and driving."

Pacey said the importance of the messages has been the conversation that it leads to regarding safe driving. A plain old message is white-noise, this grabs people's attention according to Pacey.

Austin Miller, a journalism and mass communications junior with an emphasis in public relations, said he wished he could see the messages all the time.

Miller said that as a public relations student, it's good see the government being personal and relatable. He made comparisons to Wendy's, one of the many social media accounts of professional organizations that are becoming more candid. Denny's, Whataburger and Arby's all engage their audienc beyond advertising.

"It's like 'we're your friends, we're here to make you laugh, we're not just a government entity, we want you to be safe', and they're just trying to get that information across however they can to make you pay attention," Miller said. "With the social media now, the instant gratification and all that I think it's OK for companies to be more candid."

Miller said he liked the idea of the contest, especially as a way of getting more conversation going around safe driving.

"People always get competitive over who can come up with the best," Miller said. "So it's a really good way to, not only get people involved, but to even raise more awareness for it."

Caroline Carpenter, a public information officer for ADOT, is one of the four people who run the social media accounts. Carpenter said they are all given lots of freedom to be personal.

"One person may talk about Star Wars because they know about that, someone else may talk more about pop culture because that's something that they know about."

Carpenter said the response rate, which is over 80 percent on Facebook, is part of what has grown their presence.

"Whether it's somebody who's complimenting us or criticizing us, we're going to respond to you and interact with you," Carpenter said.
